As an Activity Leader, you'll lead a variety of activities, including sports, workshops, talent shows, and excursions, all while using English to support students' language development. You'll provide high-quality welfare and care, ensuring a safe, supportive environment. This role offers valuable experience working with international children and teens in an inclusive setting.

Key Responsibilities:

- **Lead and Facilitate Activities:** Plan, organise, and lead a range of engaging activities such as sports, creative activities, talent shows, movie nights, discos, and other recreational events.
- **Supervise Excursions :** Lead and supervise students on educational excursions, ensuring the group's safety, promoting engagement with the learning experience, and providing assistance as needed.
- **Supervise Meal Times:** Be involved in supervising students in Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner.
- **Support English Language:** Communicate with students in English during all activities, helping them to improve their language skills and providing an immersive language experience in a supportive environment.
- **Collaborate with Colleagues:** Work as part of a team with other activity leaders and staff to ensure the smooth running of the programme, contributing to team discussions and shared responsibilities.
- **Ensuring Safety:** Maintaining a safe and positive environment for all participants. This includes being aware of safety procedures and emergency protocols.

- **Non-residential Activity Staff:** 13 sessions per week (up to 39 hours), including activities, excursions, pastoral, and meal duties.
- **Residential Activity Leaders:** 14 sessions per week (up to 42 hours per a week), including activities, excursions, pastoral, and meal duties.
- **Contracted Hours:** May vary throughout the contract. An example for a residential Activity Leader could be working 16 sessions in week 1 and 12 sessions in week 2
- **Activity Sessions:** Each lasts up to 3 hours, covering both sporting and non-sporting activities.
- **Educational Excursions:** Staff will supervise and lead groups, with training and guidelines provided.
- **Additional Hours:** Option to work up to 48 hours per week with an opt-out agreement.
- **Staff Training:** Attendance required; £75.00 contribution provided at contract end to staff who attend all the training sessions (Online & in-person)

PLEASE NOTE: Residential staff have board and accommodation included, though a weekly accommodation supplement of £74.62 will be deducted.
